Stober Stampede



Halloween Reminders



Building Reading Fluency at Home

Being able to read fluently is an important part of building a proficient reader and strongly correlates with overall reading achievement. Building reading fluency at home only takes 20 minutes per day and provides a positive reading model for children. Below are 10 steps to help your child become a fluent reader, thus become a proficient reader.

- You and your child choose a book together, not too hard or too easy. Your child shouldn't miss more than 1 or 2 words on a page.
- Activate your child's knowledge about the book topic beforehand.
- Discuss the book title and the book cover; stimulate thinking about story possibilities— Who? What? Where? When?
- Make some predictions about the story's plot.
- The parent and child read together until the child signals (a tap for example) that he or she • can read alone.
- When the child makes a mistake, the parent joins back in the reading. •
- Again, your child can signal you when he or she is ready to read alone again. •
- Continue this cycle for about 20 minutes. •
- Praise your child for signaling when appropriate, trying hard to figure out unknown words • and reading smoothly and evenly.
- After reading, talk about what was read. •

Did you know that October is National Bullying Prevention Month? Both the overall increased use of social media platforms in our culture and our students' use of the TechForEd 1:1 devices have given us a new perspective on this topic.

During the month of October, many of our fifth and ninth grade classrooms will engage in digital citizenship learning related to **Cyberbullying, Digital Drama & Hate Speech**. Unfortunately, many students will encounter mean behavior at some point in their digital lives. Some of these experiences are easily forgotten, while others can have deep, long-lasting effects. For families, the key is staying involved in your children's' lives -- both in the physical and online worlds -- so you can step in and offer help if necessary. This month, you can help your child(ren) learn how to avoid the drama and stand up for others by using these resources:


